





Size of the funding proposal





## How are funding proposals developed and evaluated?



## Challenges around IPs and CSO supervision of projects and programs

- Funding proposals are long and complex documents, often more than 100 pages long, and also include annexes.
- FP are only available in English
- Little time to review: At least 120 days before the Board meeting for Category A or I-1 projects or programs.
- At least 30 days before for Category B or I-2 projects or programs.
- The Board almost always approved projects, even when there's ferocious opposition from civil society
